#### **Guidelines:**

SJMIS provides staff opportunities to participate in English language training or workshops to improve proficiency if needed.

# 7. Support for Non-Native English Speakers

At SJMIS, non-native English speakers are supported with resources and opportunities in many ways, such as the English Language Development program (ELD) or different language exchange programs, to help them become more comfortable communicating in English.

### 8. Inclusive Approach
